Highlighted rows are political subdivisions participating in the Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ) The TIRZ reimbursable rate is \$1.3109 per \$100 valuation of eligible projects. A percentage of the rate that is reimbursable based on the economic impact analysis of the project.

The maximum 2.0 percent of the local option amount is collected within the City of Killeen. Of that 2.0 percent:

- 1.0 percent has been approved by voters to go to the City of Killeen's General Fund;
 - .5 percent has been approved by voters to be used for the purpose of rolling back the effect of property taxes;
- and,
- .5 percent has been approved by voters county-wide to go to Bell County.

Killeen City Council rebate considerations are limited to the 1.0 percent dedicated to the General Fund. The portion dedicated to the purpose of rolling back the effect of property taxes and Bell County are restricted and cannot be rebated.

The city's current policy requires the following to qualify for a sales tax rebate:

- a \$5 million capital investment;
- the creation of the equivalent of 75 new jobs; and,
- at least \$100,000 in new city sales tax revenues per year.

The maximum rebate permitted under the current policy is .5 percent (or ½ of that dedicated to the General Fund) for up to five years. Exceptions can be, and have been, made to the policy on a case-by-case basis.
